    - ii. **Level 2** Required Rarely flexible Any shift in the allocation will maintain the intended purpose of the original allocation. Principals must show how they will meet related programmatic requirements.
    - iii. **Level 3** Flexible These allocations are provided to schools to budget for staff and programming.
